- Coaching, mentoring and life-long learning for equipping and empowering


Purpose Statement for Member Care

What needs for care do missionaries have? **Communication**

- Church
- Sending organization
- Family/friends
- Tools: Skype, Facebook, What's App
- Programs:
- Assessment: CernySmith
- Two-way
- Touch points: even simple
- Communication is necessary for relationship and is the means by which we express care

- Community (on field and at home)
- Missionaries need to be connected to their church and their sending agency
- Family and Friends
