#### QUESTIONS:

Do we pray for extended family members of missionaries?

How can we honor and support extended family members of missionaries in our congregations? Are we intentional about engaging the extended family of our missionary?

Do we help to build the extended family relationships of our missionary families or do we add to the tension missionaries feel to relate to their supporting churches / friends and their extended family?

Do we encourage missionary families to plan and take quality time with their extended families?

What can we do as a church / friends to promote and facilitate special times for missionary families with their extended families?

#### PRINCIPLES:

It's not easy to be related to a missionary!

Validate the **legitimacy of loss** and grief for a family member. (At times it can be overwhelming.)

(What are some of the losses?)

Goodbyes are hard. Missionaries and their families experience many transitions and goodbyes.

Holidays (birthdays, anniversaries, births and deaths) are especially difficult.

Honor extended family members in appropriate ways - personally & publicly with sensitivity

• Inviting a Missionary's relative(s) to share in our family life

Instead of asking "how can I help," take the initiative to pray and do.
